DISCUSSION QUESTIONS



1. Larry was really convinced that he wouldn't be cool without his oven mitt hat, but then he fell in the sink! Have you ever wanted to do something just because everyone else was doing it? Did it actually make you cool, or did it hurt you in the end?
2. When the factory workers were allowed to eat as many bunnies as they wanted, some people went crazy and felt sick afterwards. Why did Rack, Shack, and Benny decide they should stop eating? Who taught them it wasn't smart to eat so much candy? Do you think the adults in your life know what's best for you? Do you think God knows what is best for you?
3. Is it hard to obey your parents when you aren't with them? Why or why not?
4. As Rack, Shack, and Benny learned, when we do what is right, sometimes things work out for our good, and sometimes they don't. Should we do what's right even when we aren't sure how things will turn out?
5. Why was it wrong for Nebuchadnezzar to command everyone to bow down and worship the bunny statue? Look up Exodus 20:3-6 and Psalm 135:15-18. Why doesn't God want us to have idols?
6. Do you think it's hard to stand up for what you believe in? Is it hard to obey God when everyone of your friends are not? How can you tell others about Jesus when they tempt you to do something that you know is wrong?
7. In the end, it was the teachings of their parents that helped Rack, Shack, and Benny know what was right and wrong. In the same way, God has given us instructions and teachings in the Bible. How can knowing what the Bible says help us know what to do when we are faced with a difficult situation?

CALL TO ACTION



We worship something when we give it all our time and love. An idol is something that we worship instead of God. When we worship idols, we disobey God and end up doing things that are wrong. Disobedience comes from choosing to do what we want instead of what we know is right. Nebuchadnezzar was a real king (you can read more about him, Daniel, and this story in Daniel 1-6) and he did not obey God. This week, write a letter to your parents, teachers, or anyone who has helped teach you to do what is right and thank them. Then pray and thank God for giving you those people and for giving you His Word!
