July 23-29, 2023

We are officially beginning preparation for a return visit to Belize. This is a Central American country, adjacent to Mexico and Guatemala. This will be our eighth time to minister in this place we have come to love so dearly. The dates for this mission effort will be July 23-29. We will be working in conjunction with Thirst Missions – whose sole purpose is to coordinate short term mission trips to Belize. Once again, we will be in good and experienced hands as we continue this missions tradition.

The itinerary will look somewhat like this: We'll fly out of Dallas for the 3-hour flight to Belize City on the morning of Sunday, July 23. Then we'll travel in country to our lodging destination. Our plans are to return to San Estevan in the Orange Walk district, where we will do VBS and other work projects. In addition, we will spend time in an orphanage outside the capital city. At the end of the week, we'll catch a water taxi out to Caye Caulker for some snorkeling at the second biggest barrier reef in the world. And then on Saturday, July 29, we'll fly back to Dallas.



What would something like this cost?

Good question. The final cost is still being determined but should be in the \$2,000 range. This covers your plane ticket, as well as all lodging, in-country transportation, and most meals. There will also be an individual expense incurred prior to the trip for those without passports. Of course, there will be personal spending money during the trip to consider.

Meeting the huge financial demands of a trip like this will require an aggressive fundraising campaign. Not too many of you can whip out the checkbook and write out a check of this amount. Our students who have participated in similar mission trips have had great success in raising support through fundraising letters sent to family members and friends. Sample fundraising letters are available. We will also have our annual golf tournament at Cottonwood Creek Golf Club (date is already set for Friday, May 26, 2023) to assist with fundraising.

Pray with your family about this opportunity. If you think this might be God's will, fill out a Mission Trip application and turn it in with a \$100 deposit. Also, you will want to get to work on getting a passport if you don't already have one. *Eligibility for this trip is for those who will have completed the 9th grade by the summer of 2023.*
