Frequently Asked Questions FAQ's

Q. My child is highly allergic to peanuts. What do I need to do?

A. Make sure that the host home is aware. You can do this when you drop them off at their assigned house on Friday at 7:00pm.

Q. We have a soccer game on Saturday. Can I pick my child up and then bring them back? How do I do that?

A. Tell the host home and the leaders that you will be picking them up and returning them. There is a process in place for this. A schedule of the weekend will be provided at the kick-off and posted on the website.

Q. What do they need to bring?

A. The list of items to bring can be found on the participant information tab on the youth website.

Q. We missed the Wednesday night kick-off because of a conflict. Where can I get the sweatshirt?

A. We did not hand out sweatshirts at the kick-off this time. They will be with the leaders at the host home and students will receive them there.

Q. What time is Chi Alpha over and where do I pick up my child?

A. We are done at noon on Sunday, January 19. We will attend big church during the 11:00 service. Their stuff will be at The Venue (across the street from our main campus). Please make sure you don't forget that!

Q. My student is registered and I did not receive any information about the weekend. What do I do?

A. Check your email junk/spam folders. If no luck, email Terri Jones (tjones@firstwoodway.org) to confirm registration. The youth website (www.firstwoodway.org/youth) has the participant information email as well.

Q. We missed the kick-off and did not find out where the host home is. Where do I find that information?

Q. My child is gluten free. Will there be gluten free meals offered during the weekend? What do I do about that?

A. For the meals offered at the church (dinner Saturday and breakfast Sunday), there will be GF options. Tell your student to look for or ask for those. At the host home, please make sure you let the host know when you drop them off so they are aware.
